## FEBRUARY 2021

## Marysville Fire Department:

- The Marysville Fire District received 28 calls for service to Quil Ceda Village. Eight of those calls for service resulted in medical transportation.
- Average response time was 7 minutes 41 seconds.

## **Tulalip Police Department Monthly Report:**

 Calls for domestic violence and robbery have gone down. This is likely due to reduced foot traffic in the area.

#### **Tulalip Tribal Court:**

 Motion was made and carried to adopt Resolution 2021-03 ratifying the reimbursement transfer of funds from the Quil Ceda Village main account and Quil Ceda Village Enterprise account in return of the CARES Act leave reimbursements in the amount of \$355,497.98 from Quil Ceda Village Government and \$153,759.84 from the Enterprises for the March and April Administrative leave in the aggregate amount of \$489,227.82 effective as of December 30, 2020.

#### **Finance**

- Motion was made and carried to adopt Resolution 2021-04 authorizing the execution of Contract Amendment No. 1 with Helix Design Group for the Quil Ceda Village Car Wash Project not to exceed \$313,460.00 with funding to come from the Capital Projects Budget.
- Motion was made and carried to adopt Resolution 2021-05 authorizing the execution of Contract Amendment No. 6 with Helix Design Group for the Tulalip Liquor Store Update Project in the amount of \$30,830.00 with funding to come from the Tulalip Liquor Store Update Project budget.

#### **MARCH 2021**

- Motion was carried to adopt Resolution 2021-06 approving the updated Quil Ceda Village COVID-19 Employee Health and Safety Policy to be effective April 1, 2021.
- Motion was carried to adopt Resolution 2021-07 authorizing the transfer of funds from the QCV tax account to the QCV main operating account for the 2nd Quarter operating expenses.
- Motion was carried to adopt Resolution 2021-08 approving the 2021 Service Agreement with Quil Ceda Creek Counseling Company.
- Motion was carried to adopt Resolution 2021-09 approving the landlord consent letter for Seattle Premium Outlets as presented.
- Motion was carried to adopt Resolution 2021-10
  approving to issue the Tulalip Clinical Pharmacy a gas
  card with a spending limit of \$500, with funding to

- Motion was carried to authorize Quil Ceda Village to accept funding in the amount of \$500,000.00 for the Plant Farm project.
